

The Lower Silesia Voivode, as part of the project entitled "Integration, adaptation, acceptance. Support for third-country nationals residing in Lower Silesia", co-financed by the National Programme - the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund, organised **holiday stay for Polish and foreign children during winter break for Lower Silesia**. "KON TIKI" Łabaz and Grochantz Travel Agency was responsible for the organisation of winter camps. The company was selected by a tender for community services.

This winter camp served to integrate children of third country nationals with Polish children. Spending time together was to facilitate adaptation of foreign students in the new environment, boost their confidence, help them understand Polish culture and tradition, and assist in establishing new acquaintances and friendships. Integration trips have allowed children of third-country nationals to learn more about the country of stay and adapt to the new environment. Also, they have created an opportunity for Polish citizens to become accustomed to multiculturalism.

Winter holidays were organised in the "Zielony Las" holiday resort in Radków in the period from 8 to 22 February 2020, in the form of **four camps for primary school students**. **Participation in winter camp was free of charge** for all participants. 101 primary school students took part in wintering grounds (50 people use the Member States and 51 Polish participants).

The participants were provided with four nutritious meals a day, packed lunch and drinks. During the stays, participants took bus trips to Wambierzyce, Polanica Zdrój, Kudowa Zdrój or the coal mine in Nowa Ruda, participated in sports activities, bonfires, discos and other integration activities, as well as in meetings with police and fire brigade officers. They also willingly participated in competitions with prizes.
